# India's AI-way Seeks Smooth Infra, Backbone Being Built

India's ability to scale artificial intelligence will depend not only on ambition and talent, but also on addressing infrastructure, data quality and organisational readiness, industry leaders said at a panel discussion at the ET House at the World Economic Forum in Davos.

Infrastructure has become a CEO-level concern, not merely a technological issue, said Sylvain Duranton, managing director of BCG X, the tech build and design unit of Boston Consulting Group. "Infrastructure is super critical at a company level to build the right infrastructure with the right partners," he said, pointing to divergent global approaches ranging from US-led stacks to national backbones. India, he added, is "starting to create AI backbones that will enable all models to work, to be accessible to many".

Raju Vigesna, chairman and managing director of cloud and networks company Sify Technologies, argued that AI performance is inseparable from digital foundations. "An AI model can run only as well as the basic infrastructure," he said, adding that networks, data centres and cloud are non-negotiables.

Chakri Gottemukkala, founder and CEO of AI-based business planning platform 99 Solutions, cautioned against a narrow focus on large language models. "Eighty percent of the work has to be done in the enterprise application layer," he said, arguing that pilots have under-delivered because companies tried to push too much value creation into LLMs while ignoring legacy systems and unstructured data.

According to Duranton, power generation and equipment shortages are constraining AI infrastructure globally. Vigesna, however, said India has surplus power capacity and renewable energy

id, stressing reskilling to create new value rather than automate old tasks.

Duranton said India's entrepreneurial culture offered it an edge. "Time to usage is short in India," he said, noting that companies adopt and deploy technology faster in India than in many mature markets.

On return on investment, a growing concern for CEOs, Vigesna said India must focus on use cases rather than expensive foundational models.

"Is it consumption AI for India or does India want to be an AI services country?" Vigesna asked.

Talent is also a decisive variable. Gottemukkala pushed back against fears of AI eliminating engineering jobs. "Higher-level engineering talent is going to become more and more important," he said.

Duranton said CEOs globally are

now taking direct ownership of AI. Citing a BCG survey, he said, "72% say I'm the ultimate decision-maker in AI," and that most are prepared to persist even if short-term ROI is elusive. "94% say, if I don't get the ROI in the next 12 months, I'll continue because I know this is so important for my company and my job," he said.

Gottemukkala said early disappointment stemmed from misapplied pilots. "People were just going and doing a lot of point stuff. We have a shiny new tool that we are trying to apply," he said. What policies have you implemented to make MP the growth engine of the country?

Investments in MP go well beyond paperwork, advancing through time-bound approvals, ready industrial ecosystems, and clear and efficient implementation mechanisms. The state has aligned with national-level reforms and moved quickly to remove bureaucratic hurdles.

We rolled out 18 policies for various sectors to make it easier for businesses as part of a comprehensive plan for industrial growth. MP has an industrial land bank exceeding 500 square kilometres (approx 1.25 lakh acres).

Industrial areas have access to more than 1,000 million cubic metres (mcu) industrial water and round-the-clock reliable power supply at competitive tariffs.

How is your state implementing the Centre's deregulation push?

We have decided that investors need not keep running after officials or navigate layers of approval. MP has implemented all the measures as suggested, taking a

## Humanoid Robots a Must for Musk by Next Year

Tesla is looking to sell its Optimus robots to the public by the end of next year, according to chief executive officer Elon Musk, who said the carmaker's fortunes will be increasingly dependent on humanoid machines. The company is already using some

of the robots to do simple tasks in its factory. Musk said Thursday at the WEF he predicted Optimus would be "doing more complex tasks" by the end of 2026.

Sales to the public will begin when Tesla is "confident that it's very high

reliability, very high safety, and the range of functionality is also very high," Musk said.

The comments offer a more concrete timeline for the future business line, which Musk sees as a key focus for Tesla going forward, alongside artificial intelligence and autonomous vehicles. The automaker's core business of selling cars has suffered from a stale product lineup and the loss of EV incentives in the US, leading to two consecutive years of declining deliveries. —Agencies

## Investments in MP Go Beyond Paperwork

Madhya Pradesh has introduced multiple reforms and is offering financial incentives for setting up new industries, emerging one of India's most investment-ready destinations, chief minister Mohan Yadav has said. Speaking at the ET House with Deepshikha Sikarwar during the World Economic Forum in Davos, the CM listed its central location, regulatory clarity, ample land reserves and surplus electricity as core advantages of his state. Yadav said Madhya Pradesh is fully prepared to translate these strategies into tangible outcomes on the ground. Edited excerpts:

At the WEF, what is Madhya Pradesh's big pitch to foreign investors, and what has been their response?

Everyone wants to connect with India. And the way India's growth is moving forward under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the country has taken a very long leap. India was 11th largest economy; now it is at fourth. In two years, it will be the third. And in the coming 25 years, India will be among the world's leaders.

Madhya Pradesh wants to play the most important role in this progress. We have prepared our plan and are committed to it. We are also cooperating with other states—for example, distributing electricity with Uttar Pradesh. So, we are ensuring economic growth as well as regional accessibility.

lead. Whenever the Indian government brings reforms, we have implemented them quickly. Look at labour reforms. We have already implemented them. Women are permitted to work 24x7. If there is any inadequacy in our state policies, we immediately address them. We continue to tweak state-level regulations to attract employment-generating industries by offering them differentiated benefits. We have a single-window approval system.

How is MP's green energy push faring?

We are moving forward in every way on green energy. The state is working on solar, wind and storage projects, including decentralised units, along with conventional power to have sufficient supply for its growing electricity demand. The power capacity additions will help the state meet its requirement in adding infrastructure, especially data centres, and also supply to other states. We are protecting forests and following all rules. The state is also exploring possibilities in methane gas from cowsheds.

You have identified the tourism sector as a key focus...

MP is promoting religious, medical, and wellness tourism. Our heritage locations can be very attractive as a wedding destination. The state government is offering multiple incentives to create infrastructure. We are providing all facilities for forests, which is why tourism has a big role in the state. We have also prepared a list of cultural programmes that will be supported by the state.


